
Breaking the Chain

The Teacher: Ayya Santussika Bhikkhuni is a fully ordained Theravada Buddhist female monastic. Before her ordination, Ayya Santussika lived, studied and practiced in large and small communities of nuns, including Amaravati and Chithurst monasteries of the Ajahn Chah tradition in England. She began traveling in Asia in 1999, learning from master teachers, particularly in Thailand. It was these experiences, along with time spent at Abhayagiri Buddhist Monastery in California that caused her faith to develop to the point of choosing to live and practice as a Theravadan nun. At present, she is the founding resident of Karuna Buddhist Vihara, a neighborhood monastery in Mt. View CA. In addition to teaching Dhamma, Ayya Santussika serves as a director for Buddhist Global Relief and engages in climate change action. Ayya offers the Buddha's teachings with clarity and strength, by means of a humble and kind presence. The Topic: When the Buddha was looking for a way out of suffering, one of the things he discovered was the causal chain that leads to suffering. Once this chain is understood, we can find the weakest links and go to work on breaking them in our own direct experience. During this weekend retreat, we will focus on the link between sankhara (mental formations) and vinnana (consciousness) and the link between vedana (feeling) and tanha (craving). Then we will explore another causal chain: the one that begins with suffering and ends in nibbana.

Cost: \$25.00 for BIMS (Bellingham Insight Meditation Society) pledge-members, \$50.00 for non-members. In order to encourage young people to attend, we are asking a \$25 fee for anyone 35 and younger, regardless of pledging status.
